We wish you an enjoyable holiday with families and friends, and a smooth ride into 2021!



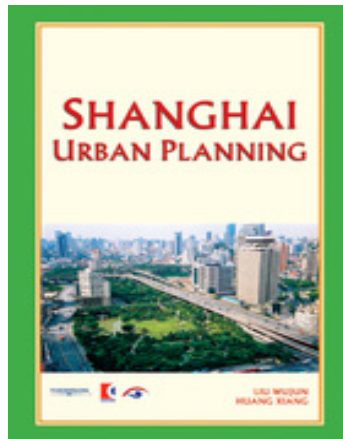
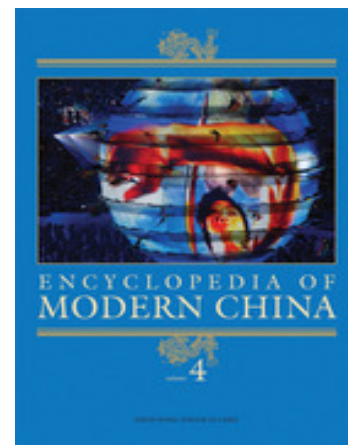
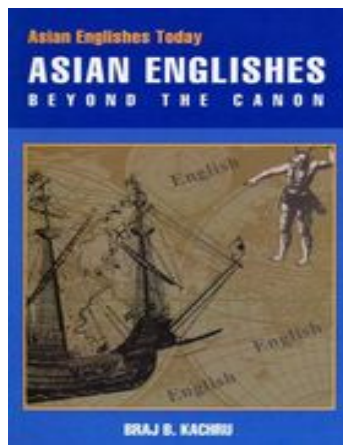
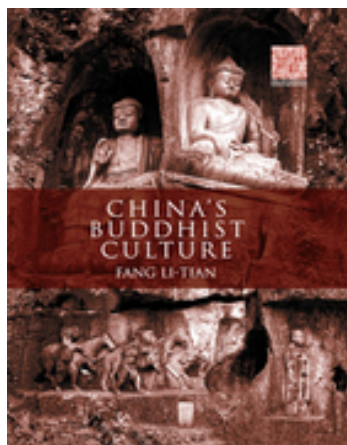
## E-resources & E-news Display at Circulation Counter

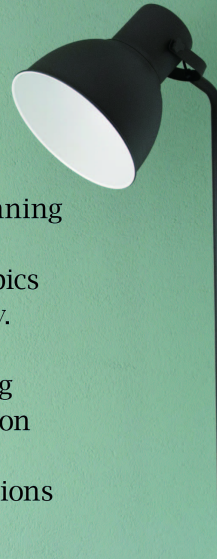
